Charged on oath with having, on the 13th of September last, at Leeds, in the West-riding, feloniously broken and entered the dwelling-house of David Asquith, there situate, and stolen therefrom forty-seven pounds of weight of sugar, one hempen bag, twelve pounds weight of tea, five pounds weight of tobacco, three linen shirts, one silk handkerchief, and one knife, the property of the said David Asquith.

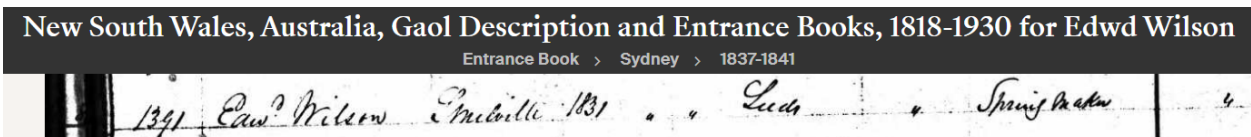

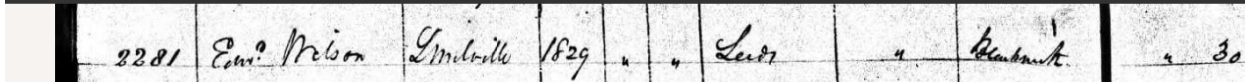

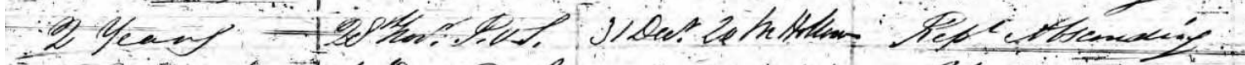

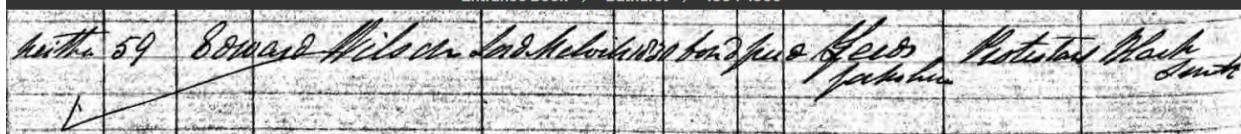
