DEATH OF MRS. MILNE

OUR neighborhood has once again been visited by the Great Reaper who has garnered in one of our number, in a full age, like as the shock of corn cometh in in his season; **Mrs. Milne, mother of the Rev. David Milne**, who has on different occasions, and for some little time past, resided at the Manse with her son, one day last week contracted what was regarded as a mild cold. On Wednesday she appeared slightly distressed and Dr. Matthews was called in and confirmed the opinion of Mr. Milne in that the ailment was the result of a cold. On Wednesday night Mrs. Milne was very sleepless, but although there were no symptoms to warrant fears of any serious consequences, she fully, anticipated the end was near, and her conversation for the most part concerned her wishes as to the disposal of her possessions and her final desires. On Thursday morning little or no change was noticeable, and, during the short time she was alone while the family were breakfasting, she arose, and crossed the room, and then returned to bed. After some little refreshment she brightened up, and considerable improvement seemed apparent, but in a few minutes a marked change came over her and the worst fears were entertained. Mr. Milne immediately went for the doctor, but although he was absent but a few minutes on his return he learned that his mother had sank in her last long sleep, death resulting from failure of the heart's action. **The deceased lady was born in Aberdeen, and first came to the colonies in 1837, but afterwards again visited the old country.** At the time of her death she was just nearing the age of 86 years. She was hale and hearty up to the end of her days, and only last week walked from the Manse to the Post-office to post her own letters. She was of an unselfish, kind hearted and quiet disposition, and beloved of her acquaintance. The funeral took place on Saturday afternoon, and evidence of the respect and esteem in which the late Mrs. Milne was held, and the sympathy that was felt for the family, was manifest by the attendance of friends from the immediate vicinity and outlying parts. The mortuary arrangements were carried out by Messrs. Tosh and Cosgrove, and the service of the Presbyterian Church was read at the grave by the Rev. Mr. Milne. On Sunday morning Mr. Fullard, at the Presbyterian Church, preached a thoughtful and impressive memorial service from Revelations 14th chapter 13th verse: "Blessed are the dead."
